European Commission presents its Guidelines for trans-European energy infrastructure

19.10.2011 The European Commission has published, a proposal for a regulation for trans-European energy infrastructure. This proposal aims at ensuring that strategic energy network and storage facilities are completed by 2020. To this end, the Commission has identified 12 priority corridors and areas covering electricity, gas, oil and carbon dioxide transport networks. It proposes a regime of "common interest" for projects contributing to implementing these priorities.

ACER adopts its Framework Guidelines on Gas Balancing

18.10.2011 ACER Framework Guidelines on Gas Balancing have been adopted and published. If the European Commission endorses ACER Framework Guidelines, it will then instruct ENTSOG to start working on the development of network codes on that basis.

The network code on gas balancing will apply to balancing regimes within EU borders.



TSOs and DSOs shall cooperate in developing and implementing the network code, which will apply directly to DSOs where appropriate but will only harmonise DSOs' roles to the extent necessary to implement the principles set out in these Framework Guidelines. ENTSOG shall involve DSOs in the drafting of relevant sections of the network code, adopting an efficient process of engagement through organisations representing DSOs at European level.
